


Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009

- 2,800 miles 4,500 kms
- New Rollback Powers
- Coastal Margin

Establishment

Statutory Duty Natural England has to create a long-distance walking route around the whole 2,700 mile English coast, and to identify land beside it, 'coastal margin', which will be accessible to the public on foot.

When completed it will be the longest managed coastal walking route in the world. (European E9 longer)





Coastal Access Duty

"Walking route for whole English coast - the England Coast Path (ECP) and associated coastal "margin" accessible on foot."

Coastal Access: Approved Scheme 2013

Statutory guidance NE follow.

Key criteria and features:

- Safety, convenience of path
- Path near to coast and views of the sea
- Continuity minimum interruption
- Use of existing walked lines
- Aim to strike a fair balance between public and private interests
- Uniquely low occupiers' liability



King Charles III England Coast Path - Stretch Progress



Porthoustock to Porthallow

- 2.5km realignment of SWCP following permissive routes, private tracks, historic walked routes, a historic tramway and new sections of path
- Provides uninterrupted sea views and takes path off narrow public roads offering limited coastal views




Roll Back

 Gives the power to realign the National Trail within a defined area to manage the impacts of coastal erosion







Connecting People to Nature

943 square miles 2442 square kms of new open access land Over **5,000 km** of Public Rights of Way Almost 11,000,000 people live within 5 km of the Coastal Margin = 19% of England's population.

Coastal Margin



What is the Coastal Wildbelt?

A once in a generation opportunity to develop a new national initiative for people and nature along our dynamic coastline conservation of 30% of Earth's land and sea by 2030 through protected areas and other conservation methods



30by30 at the Coastal Margin

211,336 hectares has the potential to contribute to our 30by30 biodiversity target = 1.6% of England


71% of the Coastal Margin is made up of priority habitats including:

- Mudflats
- Coastal saltmarsh
- Maritime cliff and slope
- Coastal sand dunes
- Coastal and floodplain grazing marsh

Protected Landscapes and the Coastal Margin

79% of the Coastal Margin falls outside a **National Park** or a **National Landscape**

The Coastal Margin could have a key role providing **connectivity** between these important landscapes – which is key to nature's recovery
